



Pilgrimage with Debbie - Being Fat in God's Word



Dear Ladies, As we enter into the winter season, it is often a time of overeating and gaining weight/fat as we gorge ourselves on holiday food and then the “comfort foods” of winter. As we eat more, we desire more. This is not necessarily a good thing. Instead, the winter months are a wonderful time to feast on God's Word, to, in a sense, become fat in God's Word. Psalm 63:5 says: “My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness, and my mouth shall praise You with joyful lips.” What an interesting comparison of the satisfaction that we have from time with God and in His Presence — as David compares it to the food that fills the longings of our flesh. David says in verse 1 that he will seek God early. He speaks of his soul thirsting for God, his flesh longing for God. And then as he reaches verse 5, he is satisfied. He then goes on in verse 6 to meditate on God in the night watches. And finally, in verse 11, he rejoices in God. So, in this winter season, I encourage you to be fat in God's Word. Spend time with Him, feasting on His Word. Only true satisfaction and ultimate joy comes from a growing relationship with the God who saved you, who loved you, and who is always with you. Pilgrimage with Charlene — Thanksgiving



Dear Sisters in Christ, As we begin to enter our Holiday Season, may I wish you a very Happy Thanksgiving. I would like to share some reflections on Thanksgiving past, present, & future. A brief look at the history of Thanksgiving will give us a place to start. Thanksgiving Day in the United States is an annual day of thanks for the blessings of the past year, observed on the fourth Thursday in November in each of the states, the District of Columbia, & Puerto Rico. It is a historical, national, & religious holiday that began with the Pilgrims. After the survival of their first colony through the bitter winter, & the gathering of the harvest, **Gov. William Bradford** of Plymouth Colony issued a thanksgiving proclamation in the autumn of 1621. This first thanksgiving lasted three days, during which the Pilgrims feasted on wild turkey & venison with their Indian guests.

Days of thanksgiving were celebrated sporadically until, on November 26, 1789, President Washington issued a proclamation of a nation-wide day of thanksgiving. He made it clear that the day should be one of prayer & giving thanks to God. It was to be celebrated by all religious denominations, a circumstance that helped to promote a spirit of common heritage. Credit for establishing this day as a national holiday is usually given to **Sarah J. Hale**, editor & founder of the Ladies' Magazine (from 1828) in Boston. Her editorials in the magazine & letters to President Lincoln urging the formal establishment of a national holiday of thanksgiving resulted in Lincoln's proclamation in 1863, designating the last Thursday in November as the day. Succeeding presidents annually followed his example, except for President Franklin D. Roosevelt, who in 1939 proclaimed Thanksgiving Day a week earlier--on the fourth but not the last Thursday--to encourage holiday shopping. In 1941, Congress adopted a joint resolution setting the date on the fourth Thursday of November.

Thanksgiving in my lifetime holds sweet memories of family & friends. As I reflect back to the 1st Thanksgiving I remember, I was in West Virginia. It was a cold snowy day. I remember the week or so before hearing my Mother fret about whether or not there would be a turkey with all the trimmings or if there would be a ham. I remember her praying that our Lord would provide. And God answered her prayer. We never went hungry. There was always enough "holiday" food for everyone to leave the table full and sleepy!

Before any holiday shopping (which I do very little, I am not much of a shopper), I plan to remember the original meaning of thanksgiving & to count my blessings, the Big and the Small. I am thankful that the God of Abraham, Issac, & Jacob is the God that I worship & praise. I am thankful that we have a warm, comfortable place to worship & pastors that preach God's word. I am thankful that 12 years ago, Susan Richardson, my neighbor & dear friend, invited me to visit Calvary Road Baptist Church & that I joined a Sunday School class & have become a part of CRBC.

I am thankful that my husband, Clyde, loves the Lord. I am thankful that my son, Michael, came back to us whole & alive from Iraq. I am thankful that my daughter, Melanie, loves the Lord, studies his Word, & often ministers to me. I am thankful for the Ladies in the WOW ministry & that we have sweet fellowship, but most of all, I am thankful that years ago, my Mother planted seeds of gratitude in my heart & that we have a nation that remembers to celebrate God's gifts to our nation.

The future of Thanksgiving in America could be bright! If we continue to remember the origins of this celebration & what it has meant to each of us since childhood, it will remain a time of fond memories & religious celebration. If we teach our children & grand children to always give thanks, the date will always be a time of celebration & joy. However, if those in this country who want to remove God from our money, our pledge of allegiance, & our public places are successful – then Thanksgiving may become a nameless, fall holiday, devoid of real meaning. Let's continue to stand for the spirit in which the holiday was conceived by passing on to future generations the history and memories of Happy Thanksgivings.
