Tuesday Mornings & Friday Evenings begins the week of January 30, 2007 — **Numbers & Deuteronomy Precepts Studies**—Led by Lorraine Hatcher—“Are there times when you wonder if God is listening? ...if you are following the Lord's leading to...where He wants you to be?...What can you learn from the children of Israel so that you won't make the same mistakes?” In the book of Numbers, we will seek these answers. “The second generation was ready to enter the Promised Land...time for them to renew the covenant made at Mt.
